Research objectives and methods:

As subconsultant to CH2MHill, Archaeological Consultants, Inc. (ACI) is performing an archaeological survey of all alternative alignments within the Wekiva Parkway PD&E Study project area in Orange, Lake and Seminole Counties. This study is being conducted on behalf of the Florida Department of Transportation, District Five, and the Orlando-Orange County Expressway Authority.

Portions of the project area are located within Rock Springs Run Preserve. Specifically, ACI proposes to conduct archaeological survey within the following parcels: 2934, 3269, 3279, 2917, 3083, 3257, 3066, 3036, 2936, 3051, and 2946.

Field survey will be performed by a team of four archaeologists. The fieldwork strategy entails the excavation, by shovel, of holes measuring approximately 0.5 m (1.6 ft) in diameter by 1.0 m (3.3 ft) deep. These will be placed at 25 m (82 ft) intervals in areas considered to have a high probability for archaeological site occurrence, and at 50 m (164 ft) intervals in zones of moderate site location potential. In the event that sites or isolated cultural materials are discovered, additional closer interval testing (e.g., 10 m [33 ft]) will be carried out. All excavated soil will be screened through one-quarter inch mesh hardware cloth, and at the completion of each shovel test, all test pits will be refilled. All cultural materials found will be bagged by provenience location, and subsequently analyzed and prepared for transfer and curation to the Florida Department of Environmental Protection (FDEP), or a repository to be determined by the FDEP. The excavation of an estimated 100-125 shovel tests is anticipated.

ACI has tentatively scheduled archaeological field survey within the alignment segments which pass through Rock Springs Run State Preserve during the week of July 17-21.
