

STATE ROAD 429 CORRIDOR WIDENING



PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Starting in mid 2021, the Central Florida Expressway Authority (CFX) will begin the 13-mile widening of State Road 429 (Daniel Webster Western Beltway) from Tilden Road to SR 414 (John Land Apopka Expressway). The widening, anticipated to be complete by mid 2024, will be broken into three segments to minimize impact to motorists.

CFX will add a travel lane to SR 429 in each direction between Tilden Road and SR 414 as well as sound walls along several locations of the expressway. CFX is also implementing a new design element of wider median shoulders that can temporarily accommodate additional traffic during emergency response events, such as traffic accidents or hurricane evacuations.



WHAT TO EXPECT

Anticipated Start Dates

 Segment 1 – Late 2021: Tilden Road to south of Florida's Turnpike

- Segment 2 Mid 2021: South of Florida's Turnpike to West Road
- Segment 3 Late 2021: West Road to State Road 414



WORK ZONE SAFFTY

For the safety of motorists and work crews, speed limits will be strictly enforced during construction. Speeding fines are doubled in work zones when workers are present. Motorists are reminded to change lanes for safety when they see Road Rangers assisting other motorists or flashing lights — it's Florida law.

Project Timeline: Late 2021 - Mid 2024

Estimated Project Cost: \$351 Million





The Central Florida Expressway Authority (CFX) is an independent agency of the State of Florida that operates and maintains a regional network of expressways for 3 million residents in Brevard, Lake, Orange, Osceola and Seminole counties and more than 75 million annual visitors to Central Florida. CFX's 125-mile user-funded system includes 72 interchanges, 19 mainline toll plazas, 74 ramp toll plazas and 342 bridges and eight named expressways. On average, more than 1.3 million toll transactions are recorded daily, nearly 90 percent of them electronically.
